Dear Family and Friends,

If you had a choice between: 1. living in absolute chaos but seeing a greater response from your friends towards the Gospel, or 2. living in a comfortable, convenient, predictable state and experiencing complete indifference from your friends when you share the Gospel with them, what would you choose? Honestly? Do we care about our lost friends more than our own comfort, entertainment, etc? These are hard questions that usually always come to my mind in crisis situations like these. I remember Paul's great spirit of sacrifice for his own nation:

"My heart is filled with bitter sorrow and unending grief for my people, my Jewish brothers and sisters. I would be willing to be forever cursed – cut off from Christ! – if that would save them."

What great passion! Paul would have sacrificed even his own salvation – his greatest Treasure, if he could, in order to save his brothers and sisters from eternal damnation!

As a human being with a sinful nature, that I still fight with daily, I must confess that some days I don't have this kind of attitude; some days I care more about my own pleasures, happiness, comfort, conveniences... more than my friends' salvation. But when I'm filled with his Spirit, I'm ready to pour out my whole life as an offering for these Serbs! I'm

ready to suffer in all kinds of ways just to see them come to Christ.

Within a few days, because of the virus crisis, I lost a ton of things I really like (temporarily, I hope!): church services, my gym, cafes, ministry to drug addicts, evangelizing with personal, *real* contact, practicing hospitality, visiting people, entertaining with my keyboard at birthday parties, weddings... Being in quarantine is a real bummer! (Especially for extroverts like myself)!

Like many of you all, I'm having to adjust to this strange situation and I don't think it's going very well. Please pray that God gives me wisdom to know how to continue to oversee this flock here in Temerin and evangelize in these new circumstances. In my limited mind, I see this crisis as a hinderance, but I'm quickly seeing that God is working out some really amazing plans that I would have

But then unfortunately, a few years later she had an affair and fell away from the Lord. When we moved back here just a few years ago we had her over a few times and tried to encourage her to get back with the Lord, but she was completely uninterested. I kept praying for her hoping that things would change. Then, after this crisis hit, I got a call from her that filled me with joy! She wanted me to be the one she told first about her decision to come back to the Lord! She said that this virus was kind of a "straw that broke the camel's back." It helped her realize that she just couldn't handle life anymore and desperately needed Christ. She came over the other day and we got on our knees and prayed together,

It's amazing to think about where he was just a little over a year ago – completely spiritually lost, in a psychiatric ward then in rehab.

I just can't live without His peace anymore!" he said.

Rehab Ministry

A few months ago I noticed there were some new guys in the rehab center. I asked them before our Bible study to introduce themselves. Each one shared what kind of addictions they got messed up with: from heroin to gambling. One guy named Bojan said, "I was on everything! I tried it all!" He's from Serbia, originally, but moved to Italy with his family when he was 11 because of the civil wars. (That was 28 years ago). It was there that he got messed up with drugs. He tried to commit suicide twice and was mad at the doctors for resuscitating him. The last few years before entering rehab he was living on the streets as a homeless man. His sister found the website of the rehab center and signed him up. He had no idea it was a Christian rehab and was shocked the first few days by all the activities the leaders required: reading the Bible daily, going to church where they sing... Fortunately, he stuck it out and actually started to enjoy the strange atmosphere. A few weeks ago, after one of our services, he responded to an invitation to receive Christ. He wanted to talk to me one-on-one:
